## Early Reading Together® and Reading Together® Te Pānui Ngātahi:

- \* are workshop programmes developed by Jeanne Biddulph MNZM which have been successfully implemented in New Zealand since the early 1980s (see <a href="https://www.readingtogether.net.nz/blog/history-of-reading-together-in-new-zealand.html">www.readingtogether.net.nz/blog/history-of-reading-together-in-new-zealand.html</a>)
- focus on areas of learning (i.e. language and literacy) that all parents recognise as being important
- enable parents/whānau to learn specific and constructive ways of helping their children at home
- are practical, user friendly, enjoyable and manageable programmes for teachers, librarians, parents and children
- ❖ have positive effects on children's language, literacy and social development
- enable teachers, parents and librarians to work together to support children's learning more effectively than teachers, parents or librarians can accomplish on their own
- build more positive relationships between children, parents/whānau, teachers and community librarians
- help families to access support from librarians and to borrow books and other resources from libraries
- provide effective support for children and parents from diverse language/literacy, cultural, educational and socio-economic backgrounds
- have a sound theoretical and research basis
- are cited in United Nations and OECD reports as successful parental-involvement programmes in New Zealand

## Early Reading Together®:

- helps parents/whānau to support the language and literacy learning of babies to 5 and 6 year olds (who are reading at emergent level) to:
  - o understand more fully the ways in which talking with young children and reading to them (from the time they are babies) helps their language and literacy development
  - explore ways of supporting children's language and literacy learning when they are reading stories and rhymes, and singing songs together
  - o find out more about books, rhymes and songs which are suitable for young children and enjoyable for them
- is implemented by experienced educators in ECE services, schools and community organisations, in collaboration with community librarians
- has been endorsed by Dr Sarah Alexander, Chief Advisor of the Office of Early Childhood Education (oece.nz). The OECE is the lead public advisor on early childhood education and care, covering and representing the whole early childhood sector in New Zealand.

  - o reluctant readers
  - o competent readers
